

What is the Division of Public Health?

The Division of Public Health, also called the Davie County Health Department, is a part of Davie County Health and Human Services (HHS) and serves as the local health department for Davie County.

What does the Division of Public Health do?

Clinical services from child health to communicable disease control, nutrition services for mothers and children, environmental health services, programs combating opioid misuse, and community health education and promotion.

What about insurance/cost?

For clinical programs, we accept patients with Medicaid and other insurance plans, including private insurance. We also accept patients without insurance. For many, the services we offer are free or low-cost.

Language interpretation services are always available at no cost.

Clinical

Child Health

- Pediatric care including well child/infant checkups, sick visits, and physical exams for childcare/school.

Immunizations (Shots)

- Childhood shots required for childcare, school, and college.
- Adult shots for work and communicable disease prevention.

Maternal Health

- Prenatal care including physical exams, lab testing, and education for pregnant women.

Family Planning

- Physical exams, education, pregnancy testing, STD testing, pelvic exams, and birth control.

Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) Program

- Testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections (STI), also known as sexually transmitted diseases (STD).

Breast and Cervical Cancer Control

- Testing, diagnosis, counseling, and referrals for treatment of Breast and Cervical Cancer.

Communicable Disease Control

- Testing, treatment, and counseling for contagious diseases including Tuberculosis.

Care Management

Pregnancy Care Management

- Help getting prenatal healthcare, financial help, and other services.
- Support and guidance for your pregnancy and postpartum.

Care Coordination for Children (CC4C)

- For children birth to five years of age.
- Working with parents, health care providers, and community members to meet children's needs.

Other Services

Coordinated Opioid Response

- Community Response Team, Community Paramedic Program, Jail Diversion Program, Child Welfare services for substance-involved families, naloxone distribution.

Health Education

- Promotion and education of important Public Health information.

Community Health Assessment

- In-depth report, on the health of the community, conducted every three years.

Vital Records and Administrative Services

Nutrition

Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

- Provides nutrition advice, breastfeeding support, referrals for health services, and financial benefits to buy healthy food.

Environmental Health

Food, Lodging, & Institution Facility Sanitation

- Operational permits for new food, lodging, and institution establishments.
- Inspections of food, lodging, institution, and child care facilities.

Onsite Water Protection

- Permits for new septic systems and drinking water well construction.
- Installation and operations inspections for septic systems and drinking water wells.
- Repair permits to help maintain safe conditions of existing septic systems and new drinking water wells.

Other programs

- Childcare and Schools, Childhood Lead Investigations, Public Swimming Pools, Tattoo Artist, Migrant Housing.
